General Educational Development (GED)

GED stands for General Educational Development. The GED test consists of four exams: Reading Though Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, and Mathematical Reasoning Objectives are based on Common Core College and Career Readiness standards. The GED is computer-based, but you cannot take it online. You can only take the GED at official testing centers, conveniently located in our division.

After testing you earn a GED certificate or credential, which is awarded by the GED Testing Service

National External Diploma Program (NEDP)

The National External Diploma Program (NEDP) is an applied performance assessment system that assesses the high school level skills of adults. The NEDP evaluates the reading, writing, math and workforce readiness skills of participants in life and work contexts.

Assesses high school level skills awarding a traditional diploma so graduates can meet their academic and career goals.

Designed for self-directed adults with life and work experiences and a general familiarity with the computer.

Offers flexible scheduling and confidentiality.

Evaluates competencies in ten content areas including Financial Literacy, Health Literacy, Civic Literacy, Geography, History, Science, and Twenty-First Century Workplace.

Advisor/Assessor available through Bedford County Public Schools.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

Instructional program that provides basic educational services to adults who are not native speakers of English; primary goal is proficiency in the four English language skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening.
